- > P. O. Box rental is required of students living on-campus.
- > Purchase of TCU health insurance is required for students not covered by another plan. TCU health insurance cost \$1,082 per term.
- > A TCU parking permit is required for any vehicle parked on campus.
- > Lab courses (such as Biology) and private music lessons have an additional fee of approximately \$50 per credit hour. Band students may have an additional fee of \$100 per semester.
- > Book and supply costs vary by student – we use an estimate of \$900 per year.
- > Any Federal Work-Study wages earned are not credited toward your TCU amount due. These wages are paid directly to you on a biweekly basis.

Step #1 for most financial aid programs is filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). File online at fafsa.ed.gov, and sign electronically to expedite processing. Incoming freshmen and transfer students are also required to complete the [CSS Profile](#) for consideration of institutional need-based aid.

Search for scholarships – TCU recommends free scholarship searches like fastweb.com. Your high school counselor may be a good resource for info as well. Admitted TCU students will have access to [Horned Frog Scholar Search](#).

When you receive your Award Notification from TCU, view the information online at my.tcu.edu. After you log in, click on Financial Aid, and then “Accept/ Decline Financial Aid” to accept or decline the various awards available to you. Click on each award for further information about that program. Once you accept an award, we’ll send you more information by email regarding any other steps required to secure those funds.

Compare your resources to your estimated costs to determine if there is a “gap.” The worksheet on the back of this form will help you – remember to consider the financial aid you have been awarded (including scholarships and grants) as well as educational loans you plan to take out and any other resources your family intends to use toward your education (savings, 529 plans, current income, etc.).

Important! Watch your email for communications from Financial Aid, and check your “Requested Information” section of my.tcu.edu often- that’s where we’ll tell you what needs to be done to make sure your financial aid is ready for you when the year begins!

Loans – Log on to financialaid.tcu.edu and select “Types of Aid” then Loans. All the loan programs TCU helps administer to students, as well as additional loans that TCU recommends for students who need them, can be found here. We’ll let you know when it’s time to apply.
